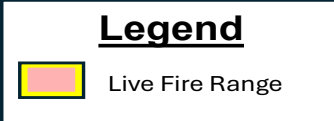


## Moore County Wildlife Conservation Club Live Fire Range Complex

| 1 | Steel Pistol Plate Range (maximum distance 50 yds)                         |

| 4 | General Firearms, Paper Targets (maximum distance 25 yds)                  |
| 5 | Rifle Range (Paper & Steel) (two bays, max distance 75 yds and 100 yds)    |
| 6 | General Firearms, Paper Targets (two bays, max distance 25 yds and 50 yds) |
| 8 | Shotgun Range – 7.5 Bird Shot or smaller; four synchronized clay throwers  |

## SAFE RANGE USE GUIDANCE

DESIGNATION: Range 1 (Steel Pistol Plate Range)



MAXIMUM DISTANCE FOR STEEL TARGET ENGAGEMENT: **50 yards**

MINIMAL DISTANCE FOR STEEL TARGET ENGAGEMENT: **10 yards**

- Each shooter must inspect each steel target they are shooting, for any pitting damage, deformity, cracks, or loose, broken, or missing bolts/pins before use. **DO NOT SHOOT IF DAMAGED.**
- **ONLY USE** the following calibers: 22LR, .32, .380. 9mm, 38 SPL, .40 and .45 ACP
- **ONLY USE** ammo with a velocity not exceeding 1,500 fps or less than 750 fps
- **ONLY USE** ball, JHP or similar soft-tip rounds having a predictable splatter pattern
- **NEVER USE** +P, Magnum, Steel (core or cased) or any other harden ammunition
- Eye and Ear protection is required at all times for shooters and spectators
- This range is intended for firearms without a shoulder stock and barrel length under 16"
- Always keep the muzzle pointed down-range and at the berm
- When doing a shooting and moving drill, a gun in a proper fitting holster is safe for carrying up-range
- Don't walk up-range with a gun in your hand
- Don't handle your gun when someone is down-range or in front of you
- Adhere to published shooting hours
- When shooting concurrently as a group, maintain a common firing line(180-degree rule)
- Shooters under 18 must be under the direct supervision of a MCWCC member
- Police your brass



## SAFE RANGE USE GUIDANCE

DESIGNATION: Range 2 (Training Range)



MAXIMUM DISTANCE FOR TARGET ENGAGEMENT: **15 yards**

- THIS RANGE IS CURRENTLY CLOSED TO THE GENERAL MEMBERSHIP (Target Frame and Berm enhancements are scheduled for this range)
- May be reserved by approved Instructors for conducting classes
- Only targets approved by the MCWCC CRSOs may be used on this range
- Eye and Ear protection is required at all times for shooters and spectators
- Always keep the muzzle pointed down-range and at the berm
- When doing a shooting and moving drill, either use a movable table to move your gun or have your gun in a proper fitting holster for carrying up-range
- Don't walk up-range with a gun in your hand
- Don't handle your gun when someone is down-range or in front of you
- Adhere to published shooting hours
- When shooting concurrently as a group, maintain a common firing line(180-degree rule)
- Shooters under 18 must be under the direct supervision of a MCWCC member
- Police your brass

## SAFE RANGE USE GUIDANCE

DESIGNATION: Range 3 (General Firearms up to 7 yd & 15 yd Stands)



MAXIMUM DISTANCE FOR TARGET ENGAGEMENT: **15 yards**

Movable target stands are designed to fit into track frame behind the railroad ties



- Target Frames are set for 7 yds (right side) and 15 yds (left side)
- The canopy bench is the maximum permitted Firing Line for this range
- Shotgun slugs only permitted on this range
- Eye and Ear protection is required at all times for shooters and spectators
- Always keep the muzzle pointed down-range and at the berm
- When doing a shooting and moving drill, either use a movable table to move your gun or have your gun in a proper fitting holster for carrying up-range
- Don't walk up-range with a gun in your hand
- Don't handle your gun when someone is down-range or in front of you
- When shooting concurrently as a group, maintain a common firing line(180-degree rule)



## SAFE RANGE USE GUIDANCE

DESIGNATION: Range 4 (General Firearms up to 25 yds)



MAXIMUM DISTANCE FOR TARGET ENGAGEMENT: **25 yards**

- Good for combination pistol and rifle carbine drills
- The canopy bench is the maximum permitted Firing Line for this range
- Ensure targets are hung so to minimize damaging the target frame
- Shotgun slugs only permitted on this range
- Eye and Ear protection is required at all times for shooters and spectators
- Always keep the muzzle pointed down-range and at the berm
- When doing a shooting and moving drill, a hand gun in a proper fitting holster is safe for carrying up-range; a carbine can be carried within the range limits if on a shoulder strap with the magazine removed, bolt locked back, an ECI inserted and the gun carried at a 45 degree angle (muzzle down) with hands only on the buttstock and handguard
- Don't walk up-range with a gun in your hand or with a rifle by holding its grip or receiver
- Don't handle your gun when someone is down-range or in front of you
- Adhere to published shooting hours
- When shooting concurrently as a group, maintain a common firing line(180-degree rule)
- Shooters under 18 must be under the direct supervision of a MCWCC member
- Police your brass

## SAFE RANGE USE GUIDANCE

DESIGNATION: Range 5 (Primarily Rifles up to 100 yds)



MAXIMUM DISTANCE FOR TARGET ENGAGEMENT: **100 yards**

MINIMUM DISTANCE FOR STEEL TARGET ENGAGEMENT: **100 yards**

- Range includes a 50-yard paper target stand located on right side of the range
- Shotgun slugs only permitted on this range
- When shooting steel, use ammo caliber of .308 or less; no armor piercing rounds
- When shooting steel, ammo velocity cannot exceed 3,000 fps or be less than 750 fps
- Only enter and exit this range from the covered bench area; covered benches mark the maximum permitted Firing Line
- Eye and Ear protection is required at all times for shooters and spectators
- Always keep the muzzle pointed down-range and at the berm
- Don't walk onto the range with an uncased firearm in your hand
- Don't handle your firearm when someone is down-range or in front of you
- Adhere to published shooting hours
- When shooting concurrently as a group, maintain a common firing line(180-degree rule)
- Shooters under 18 must be under the direct supervision of a MCWCC member
- All rounds must impact the berm backstop; do not skip rounds of the ground
- Police your brass



## SAFE RANGE USE GUIDANCE

DESIGNATION: Range 6 (General Firearms up to 50 yds)



MAXIMUM DISTANCE FOR TARGET ENGAGEMENT: **50 yards**

- Range includes a 25-yard paper target stand located on left side of the range
- Shotgun slugs permitted; buckshot patterning also permitted on far-right corner
- Only enter and exit this range from the covered bench area
- Eye and Ear protection is required at all times for shooters and spectators
- Always keep the muzzle pointed down-range and at the berm
- When doing a shooting and moving drill, a hand gun in a proper fitting holster is safe for carrying up-range; a carbine can be carried within the range limits if on a shoulder strap with the magazine removed, bolt locked back, an ECI inserted and the gun carried at a 45 degree angle (muzzle down) with hands only on the buttstock and handguard
- Don't walk up-range with a gun in your hand or with a rifle by holding its grip or receiver
- Don't handle your gun when someone is down-range or in front of you
- Adhere to published shooting hours
- When shooting concurrently as a group, maintain a common firing line(180-degree rule)
- Shooters under 18 must be under the direct supervision of a MCWCC member
- All rounds must impact the berm backstop; do not skip rounds of the ground
- Police your brass

## SAFE RANGE USE GUIDANCE

DESIGNATION: Range 8 (Shotguns using 7.5 Birdshot or smaller)



MAXIMUM SWING RADIUS FOR TARGET ENGAGEMENT IS SET BY LIMIT POLES

- Range includes four independent clay throwers that can be synchronized
- Range limited to Birdshot no larger than 7.5 pellet loads

- Shotguns may be uncased and placed in the shotgun racks if they are unloaded and actions open where possible. Shotguns that “break open” may be left closed in racks
- The Firing Line must be behind the Clay houses (we don’t want anyone hit by clays)
- Shotguns may be moved from the racks to the firing line and back so long as they are empty and pointed straight up. They need to be cased before leaving the rack/firing line
- Shotguns may be discharged between the red and white limit poles (painted telephone poles on either side of range)
- Eye and Ear protection is required at all times for shooters and spectators
- Don’t walk onto the range with an uncased shotgun in your hand
- Don’t handle your gun when someone is down-range or in front of you
- Adhere to published shooting hours
- All shooting occurs on the fixed common firing line
- Shooters under 18 must be under the direct supervision of a MCWCC member
- Police your spent casings



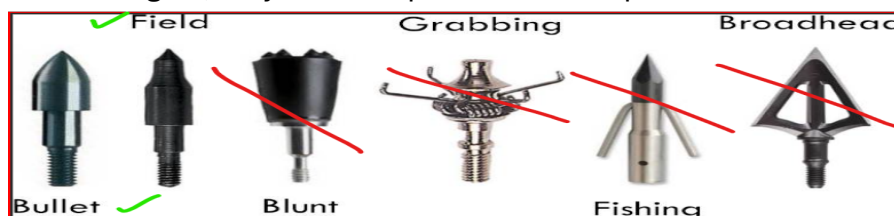
## SAFE RANGE USE GUIDANCE

DESIGNATION: Range 9 (Archery )



MAXIMUM DISTANCE FOR TARGET ENGAGEMENT: **25 yards**

- Range Axe-Throwing target is positioned on right side of range; do NOT shoot with arrows
- Crossbows are permitted for use on Club Archery targets so long as the arrowhead is of a permitted type
- No firearms are permitted on this range
- Arrows must be fired in a way that they do not leave the range area. If they pass through a target, ensure a suitable backstop is in place to retain the arrow within the range area
- If there is more than one archer, a common firing line must be established
- For Club provided targets, only use field point or bullet tip arrowheads



- Eye protection is required at all times for shooters and spectators
- When drawing the bow, keep the arrow angled towards the ground
- Don't draw your bow when someone is down-range or in front of you
- Adhere to published Rim-Fire shooting hours
- The maximum number of permitted archers at any one time is four
- When shooting concurrently as a group, maintain a common firing line(180-degree rule)
- Archers under 18 must be under the direct supervision of a MCWCC member
- All arrows must land within the range limits; do not shoot arrows into the sky
- Use Target or Field Point tips when shooting at club targets
